Pete's View of a Past Member

Last Sunday was extremely cold and the air was so crisp, my fingers tingled. It was just around lunch time and my body craved for a warm hearty meal. I entered the club and there was a large crowd gathered for the same purpose. I instantly went to the *Spitfire Grill* and ordered the Sunday Roast. Finding a table with friends from the Brotherhood, our conversation varied with solutions of world problems and jokes.

A large Honour Board fixed to the wall displayed a date and name of all past presidents and Secretaries, one name that intrigued me, Spencer Gwynne, 1947, who had the post Nominal DCM. So that is seventy years ago. I reflected to my mates that I wasn't even born, we then started talking about how things have changed since we were kids, like having our milk delivered by horse and cart, as well as the dunny man changing the bin for the outside loo.

I thought I would write an article about Spencer Gwynne DCM for the *"Furphy"*, so who was Spencer Gwynne?

SPENCER GWYNNE DCM.

Spencer Gwynne was born 3rd September 1891 in Adelaide SA, moved to Western Australia in 1905. He enlisted into 10th Light Horse on 1st October 1914 at the age of 23. He embarked for Gallipoli in February 1915 from Fremantle, Spencer fought at Popes Hill, Walkers Hill and the Nek before going to Egypt in January 1916. Gwynne was promoted to Sergeant 23rd December 1916 for his actions which resulted in him being awarded the DCM. Spencer Gwynne was the Sergeant of the Australian Guard of Honour when General Allenby entered Jerusalem.

10th Australian Light Horse Regiment. They were part of the 3rd Light Horse Brigade of the Australian Mounted Division. Sailed from Fremantle 7/2/1915. They were involved in the disastrous attack at the Nek in Gallipoli and Hill 60 and suffered significant losses.

They served in Romani, Maghdaba, Gaza 1 and 2, Beersheba, sweep to Jerusalem (including entering Jerusalem), Es Salt/Amman 2, Megiddo sweep, Damascus. They were the first Australians to enter Jerusalem, and the first regiment to enter Damascus. Like the 4th Light Horse regiment, they were also given swords and made into conventional cavalry before the Megiddo sweep. They won 106 military awards.

413, Lieutenant Spencer Gwynne DCM 10th Light Horse

Portrait of Lieutenant Spencer Gwynne, DCM. The then Sergeant Gwynne was awarded the DCM for his part in the rescue of LT A.U. Martin, who had his horse shot beneath him during the attack by the 10th Light Horse Regiment on Turkish Forces at Magdhaba.

Mentioned in Dispatches - 6th July 1917

Recommended for Distinguished Conduct Medal – 24th December 1916 Awarded Distinguished Conduct Medal – 21st August 1917 **Citation:**

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He gallantly went to the assistance of his troop officer, whose horse had been killed. He set a fine example to all ranks."

Post War: In 1920 in the Katanning district, Spencer married Florence Mary Dival.

An article in the press gave the results of the annual election of Woodanilling Road Board members, with Spencer one of two elected for the West Ward. In 1925 Spencer was Chairman of the local Returned Soldiers Reunion.

"Mr Spencer Gwynne was appointed secretary to the Woodanilling Roads Board. Spencer resigned this position in Sep 1932 in order to take up the position of Secretary to the Mingenew Road Board.

An article in relation to the suicide of a Police Constable in Mingenew lists Spencer as identifying the body having known the deceased (a fellow member of the 10th Light Horse Regiment).

Mr Spencer Gwynne was appointed as secretary-engineer for the Armadale Road Board, and on 23 Aug 1940 Spencer was elected as the President of the Armadale RSL.

In early 1942 Gwynne was called up for military duty, oversighting all units of the Bunbury Volunteer Defence Corps, based at Pinjarra. On 22 Jan 1943 Spencer was promoted to Captain in the Army.

In May 1946 Spencer gave the RSL notice that he was retiring from his position as Armadale President. However he remained with the Council until 1956. Florence died 30 Dec 1998 in Thornlie aged 100.

The major recreation reserve in the City of Armadale is named Gwynne Park in his honour, and the name is also remembered with the Gwynne park Primary School, and Gwynne Park Education Support Unit.


